Recent Changes

- Guests loved the improved, larger Damsel room – now the preferred room in the main Lodge. The new decor in the great room of the Lodge has also been well received. The addition of western antique pieces and Kilim rugs has transformed the room from rugged-rustic to cozy-rustic conversation areas. We are continuing with plans to let in more light and air. The Lodge rooms now have more working windows and screens, and the Bunk House and Cabin are scheduled to have more windows placed by the 2008 season.

The Hutchins Bridge party at The Old Kirby Place in July was a huge success. 300 people attended to help raise \$5,000 for the Madison Valley History Association. Good ol’ Western Hospitality was the theme complete with a grilled, marinated flank steak dinner and generous libations. 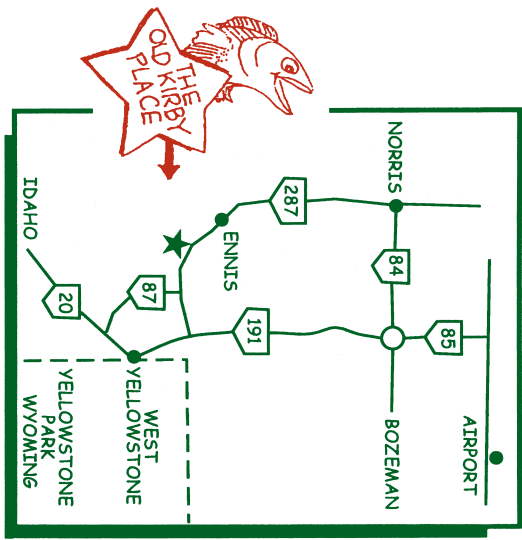
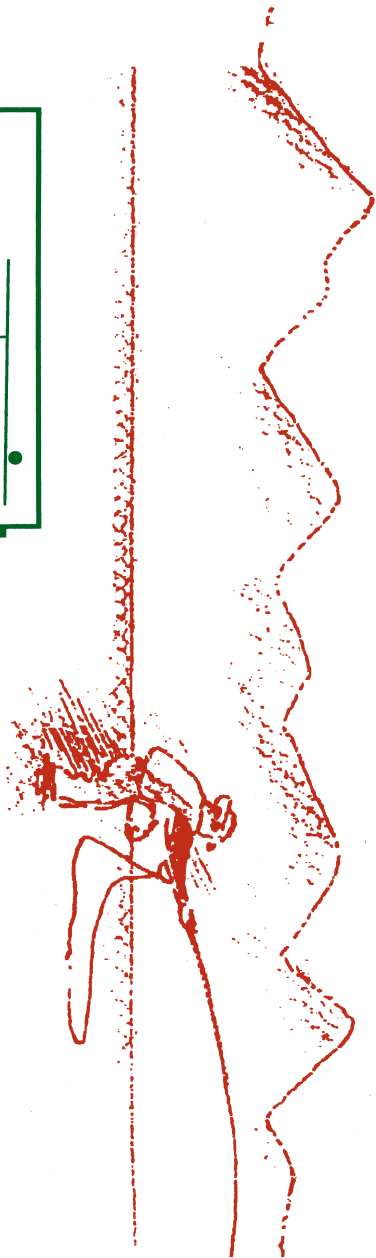
Although the 2007 season experienced one of the hottest and driest Julys on record, thanks to Hebgen Lake the Madison was one of the few rivers in Montana that was not forced to discontinue fishing activity in the afternoons. Through a controlled release of water from Hebgen Dam, the State was able to keep the water temperature cool enough to allow full fishing access on the Madison all summer.

It is fun to have groups at the Old Kirby Place who are out to relax and try their luck on the Madison. The OKP is also the perfect place for reunions, anniversaries, and maybe even weddings! Karl and Nancy will help plan any event you may have in mind.
